## **Homeowner Maintenance Guide**







## **Spring**

- Mow your CitraBlue St. Augustine between 2.5 and 3.5 inches tall.
- Apply pre-emergent herbicide. This will cut down on summer weeds.
- If you have had insect problem in the past, treat with broad-spectrum insecticide. If
  you use a granular variety, water the lawn immediately after application to help get
  it into the soil. Make sure it has control for chinch bugs.
- Don't overwater. In the active growing season, CitraBlue needs about one inch of water a week, from natural rainfall or irrigation. Too much water can cause fungus.
- Apply fungicide if needed. If you have had a fungus or disease in your CitraBlue in the past or have quite a bit of shade in the yard, apply a systemic fungicide to prevent future outbreaks.
- Feed your lawn with Lawnifi the preferred fertilizer for CitraBlue St. Augustine.

## Summer

- When mowing, never remove more than 1/3 of the leaf blade at a time. If you need to cut more than 1/3, consider multiple cuts over three to five days.
- Do not overwater the grass. CitraBlue only needs about one inch of water weekly. Water for longer periods of time, less frequently, and in the early morning hours. Take rainfall into consideration.
- Feed your lawn with **Lawnifi** the preferred fertilizer for CitraBlue St. Augustine.
- If you spot sod webworms or other caterpillar activity, be sure to apply an
  insecticide that is labeled to treat such insects and pests.

## Fall

- Apply fungicide. This will help the grass enter colder months in healthier condition. If you have had fungus before, you may need multiple applications in affected areas.
- Treat with broad-spectrum insecticide. If you use a granular variety, water the lawn immediately after application to help soil absorption. Make sure it offers control for chinch bugs.
- Mow less in cooler fall months. Leave your CitraBlue lawn slightly higher than normal to encourage deeper root growth for winter. Adjust mower settings up one notch.
- Water less. As temperatures drop grasses don't need as much irrigation. Too much watering can lead to lawn disease.
- If you haven't had past problems with winter weeds, you can forgo herbicide in the fall. If you do get winter weeds, apply a pre-emergent herbicide for prevention.
- Feed your lawn with **Lawnifi** the preferred fertilizer for CitraBlue St. Augustine.
